6	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-

4	(3) The World Bank classifies the People's Re-
5	public of China as having an upper-middle-income

7	(4) On February 25, 2021, President Xi
8	Jinping announced "complete victory" over extreme
- 9	poverty in the People's Republic of China.
10	(5) The Government of China utilizes state re-
11	sources to create and promote the Asian Infrastruc-
12	ture Investment Bank, the New Development Bank,
13	and the Belt and Road Initiative.
14	(6) The People's Republic of China is the
15	world's largest official creditor.
16	(7) Through the International Bank for Recon-
17	struction and Development, countries are eligible to
18	borrow from the Bank until they can manage long-
19	term development and access to capital markets
20	without financial resources from the Bank.
21	(8) The World Bank reviews the graduation of
22	a country from eligibility to borrow from the Inter-
23	national Bank for Reconstruction and Development
24	once the country reaches the graduation discussion
25	income, which is equivalent to the gross national in-

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1	come. For fiscal year 2021, the graduation discus-
2	sion income is a gross national income per capita ex-

4	(9) The People's Republic of China exceeded
5	the graduation discussion income threshold in 2016
6	(10) Since 2016, the International Bank for
7	Reconstruction and Development has approved
8	projects totaling \$8,930,000,000 to the People's Re-

0	(11) The World Bank calculates the People's
1	Republic of China's most recent year (2019) gross
2	national income per capita as \$10,390.
3	(b) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
4	United States to oppose any additional lending from the
5	International Bank for Reconstruction and Development
6	to the People's Republic of China as a result of the Peo-
7	ple's Republic of China's successful graduation from the
8	eligibility requirements for assistance from the Bank.
9	(e) Opposition to Lending to People's Repub-
20	LIC OF CHINA.—The Secretary of the Treasury shall in-
21	struct the United States Executive Director of the Inter-
22	national Bank for Reconstruction and Development to use
23	the voice, vote, and influence of the United States—
24	(1) to oppose any loan or extension of financial

6	(d) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than one year
